Civilizations (Archeological Sites in Qatar):


The continuous human settlement in the Arabian Gulf region has not stopped, but has been carried out by several ancient and modern civilizations, distributed in its different regions, and interacted with its geographical surroundings, the State of Qatar has enjoyed a continued human civilized activity since ancient times, and this resulted in Qatar being affected by several diverse civilizations on its lands, manifested by the emergence of many archaeological sites there.



Let's get acquainted with the civilizations and archaeological sites that existed on the lands of Qatar in different eras.

First: Ancient Civilizations in Qatar

A group of scientific missions have conducted many archaeological excavations in the State of Qatar since the middle of the last century; Such as the Danish, English and French missions, and the results indicated that man began his existence and settlement in Qatar since the Neolithic Age (approximately 8000 - 4000 BC). The history of Qatar has passed during this period in several eras and historic milestones. See the following table:



For your information:

It is the Age in which man made his tools from stones before the knowledge of writing, and it is divided into three ages: the Paleolithic - the Middle Stone Age - and the Neolithic.

Age	Historical Period
Ubaid Period	Fifth and fourth millennium BC
Bronze Age	Third millennium BC
Kassites Age	Second millennium BC
Age of Greeks and Romans	324 – 140 BC
Sasanian Age	226 – 651 AD

Second: Archeological sites in Qatar:

Qatar has been affected by several civilizations in ancient times, and these civilizations have left traces and historical evidence in multiple sites. These sites are called Ancient Archaeological Sites, and the State of Qatar has made great efforts to discover and preserve these sites, as well as in the modern era, the people of Qatar have developed their architectural methods, building forts and towers, which are known as Modern Archaeological Sites.

A) Al Asaila Site:

It is located near Umm Bab, west of Al Kharsa'ah. Al Asaila Site is one of the most ancient archaeological sites in the State of Qatar. A group of stone workshops dedicated to the manufacture of weapons and hunting tools were found in it.

B) Ras Abrouq Site:

It is located on the western coast of the State of Qatar. Sharp arrows and axes made of stone were found at the site, and it is believed that it was a fishing station.

C) Al Khor Hills Site:

Al Khor Hills is located north of Al Khor City. A single burial shaped like a pit was found in it. Human bones were found in one of the corners of this cemetery.

D) Lusail Site:

It is located on the eastern coast of the State of Qatar. A human settlement dating back to the Neolithic era was found in it, as well as a group of blades and arrowheads.


E) Murwab Fort:

Located on the western coast of the State of Qatar. Murwab Fort was built in **the Abbasi Caliphate** on the ruins of an ancient fort, and bears the Abbasid character of architecture. To the north of the fort there is a gathering of about 250 houses in the form of an arc.

Site of Zubarah list of World Heritage:

Zubarah town located near the western shore of the State of Qatar, the city has a large number of forts and military towers, the most important one of them is Zubarah Fort, which was built in 1938 in the reign of Sheikh Abdullah bin Jassim Al-Thani. The World Heritage Committee of the United Nations Educational, Cultural and Scientific Organization (UNESCO) included the archaeological city of Al Zubarah in Qatar on the UNESCO list of World Heritage sites in 2013. The Qatar Museums Authority in a statement: The accession of the city Zubarh, one of the most important archaeological sites protected, which was the largest cities of the Arabian Gulf and traditional fishing and pearl trading, to the World Heritage List, is the first to include recognition of the archaeological site a country in an international registry.





1. The Legislative Power:

- 1. The Permanent Constitution of the State of Qatar states that the Shura Council assumes the Legislative Power as follows:
- 2. The Shura Council consists of forty-five (45) members.
- 3. Thirty (30) of them are elected by public secret direct ballot, and the Amir appoints the other fifteen (15) members from the ministers or others.
- 4. The term of the Council is determined by Law at four Gregorian years.

- a. Legislate Laws; Where no law is passed without the approval of the Shura Council.
- b. Approval of the State's general budget.
- c. Oversight of the work of The Executive Power in accordance with the provisions of the Constitution.

2. The Executive Power

The Amir assumes the Executive Power, and the Council of Ministers assists him in this. An Amiri order is issued to form the ministry based on a proposal by the Prime Minister. The Council of Ministers is the supreme executive body responsible for all internal and external affairs within it, according to the provisions of the constitution and the law. The most important of these competencies are as **follows:**

- A Supervising the implementation of laws and decisions.
- B- Proposing the establishment and organization of government bodies, and institutions.

3. The Judicial Power

The Judicial Power is independent and is assumed by Court of different types and levels. They issue their verdicts according to the law., and issue judgments in the name of the Amir.

Supreme Judiciary Council was established in 1999 with the aim of supervising the work of the courts, and in 2003 a law was issued regulating the work of the courts.

The Courts of Qatar are independent. The judiciary is the guarantor of the rights and freedoms of the people in the state. In their judgment, they are dominated by no power except the law.

The Universal Declaration of Human Rights was not the first international document on Human Rights. Rather, it was preceded by several charters, such as: Magna Carta, which was issued in 1215 AD, the Bill of Rights 1689 AD, and the Declaration of the Rights of Man and of the Citizen issued in 1789 AD.

The Constitution of Qatar was issued in 2004, and it included explicit references to Human Rights, including them in the articles of the constitution relating to rights and duties.


